

Minutes of Over Wallop Parish Council Meeting held on Monday, 10th October 2016 in the Wallops Parish Hall at 7.30pm.

WELCOME.

The Chairman welcomed everyone to the meeting.

PARISH COUNCIL VACANCIES

The Clerk reported that he has not yet been informed by TVBC if the parish council can co-opt to fill the vacancies.

DECLARATION OF INTEREST.

There were no declarations of interest recorded.

MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING.

The Chairman signed the minutes of the previous meeting as a true record. Proposed by Cllr Burden and seconded by Cllr Elliott.

URGENT ITEMS

HIGHWAYS – The Chairman reported that Cllr Gibson has asked HCC Highways not to implement the new road plan with the closure of Salisbury Lane unless the project is done as a complete package with the junction at Grateley is also restructured to direct traffic along Old Stockbridge Road. Cllr Gibson believed that the closure of Salisbury Lane without the other changes would put too greater load on Station Road.

The Parish Council were not able to endorse this statement as there was no guarantee that the roadworks at Grateley would ever be funded. In addition, the parish council had not yet been briefed on the results of the survey and was therefore unable to make any recommendations.

After considerable discussion it was agreed that the chairman would contact Cllr Gibson to arrange a meeting with him, the parish council and HCC Highways to discuss the matter. Ideally this should take place soon after the results of the survey were available.

NEW NOTICE BOARD – The new notice board is being made.

PLAY AREA – Cllr Roberts reported that the Sovereign Playgrounds revised quote had been within the budget and that they would hold the price until the end of the year.

The other two companies have been informed that they have not been successful with their bids. The Clerk reported that TVBC have not yet received the Section 106 contribution from the developer of The Landings and that he will keep checking. STREET LIGHTS – The Clerk has asked SSE for a quote to replace Street Lights numbers 9 and 10 on Station Road.

POLICE AND NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH

Cllr Glover reported that there has been an increasing number of thefts from cars in the area.

REPORT FROM COUNTY CLLR GIBSON.

PARISH HALL

FOOTPATHS - The footpaths are all walkable.

PALESTINE – Delivery of the bench is imminent. Cllr Burden had nothing to report.

POUND ROAD – Cllr Elliott reported that the salt bin had not yet been replaced. Pot holes are still being monitored.
